# **Trail Work Update**

The Open Space retained Momentum Trail Concepts to assist in the maintenance and repair of our trails. Momentum is an experienced trail building and design firm with projects worldwide. They have brought a fresh view on how to design, build, and maintain trails for a very long



term. We are downright excited with their work. After a delayed start due to the spring snow storm, the work has focused on our lower trails in the vicinity of the Whale Rock Trailhead. In addition to repairing erosion damage some abandoned trails have been reclaimed including the old ranch road from the WRTH. We have received very positive and enthusiastic feedback on the work. If you get a chance get out there and see it yourselves.

# Weed Wednesdays (and Fridays)

This year Kathleen Knowlton aka "the Weed Czar" is getting a head start on those evil critters! Directly from the throne:

We are going to begin the noxious weed control efforts in our open space next week (April 19th). Each week we will set aside Wednesday 5:30-7:30 PM and Friday 7:30-9:30 AM to tackle these nasty invaders. At least initially I plan to work both sessions each week so will be available to identify species. I will seek input from all of you as to where we should be focusing our efforts.

This first week, for Wednesday evening April 19th I'd like to meet at the water tower at the plateau and tackle the mullein, toadflax and thistle on Baldy. For Friday morning April 21st we will meet at Whale Rock.

This early in the season we do not need to bag and remove any weeds since there are no seed heads yet. Please bring gloves, small shovels, sprayers and any other tool you might use to dig or pull weeds. I will buy chemicals and locate the association's backpack sprayers.

If you can make one of these times, please let me know. If you would rather work on your own as your schedule allows, please do that. We need all the manpower we can muster.

# **Basic Tag Info**

This year we are still using the Pink tags from last year. You do not need a new tag for 2017 if you had one last year. The 2017 reciprocal tags with Ken Caryl are gold.

Basic tag rules:

- 1) You must have a tag on your car if you park at a trail head
- 2) You must have a tag on your bike in the Open Space
- 3) You do not need a tag on you when hiking or riding horses in the Open Space

While we encourage everyone to help us discourage unauthorized access (poachers), we do not want any confrontations in the Open Space. When you see someone parking or biking, feel free to politely ask if they have a tag. If they do not, remind them they need one – nothing more. If we make poachers uncomfortable, the word will get out quickly and they will not come back.

If you are new to the neighborhood, did not get a tag last year, or just need new tags please put your name on our request page (again, an ugly url) and let your neighborhood rep know.
